There's no question that maintaining our fleet of vehicles is expensive. Not only do we replace rigs after about three years at a cost of around **\$380,000**; but the top-of-the-line equipment that goes inside them requires constant maintenance.

We have a full-time fleet manager on staff, just to maintain our fleet o³⁸ ambulances, and 18 additional support vehicles. He also helps navigate the intense procurement process.

Here's just a snapshot of what the procurement process looks like for each of our rigs:

- More than 24 months in advance, HEMS and the dealer staff design upcoming units
- Once the rig is procured, it is sent to the dealer to be outfitted with all of the components including cots, radios, camera systems, computer docks, an oxygen system, and much more
- It is then inspected by mechanics before being sent to the HEMS team
- Finally, once it reaches the HEMS team, our expert team installs everything else from labels to computers to oxygen tanks
- Finally, the rig is able to hit the streets for its 42-month lifespan!

At HEMS, we take pride in offering our cities top-of-the-line rigs outfitted with the latest innovations and technology – but it's certainly no small process to get there.

This success story features our Community Paramedic team, which regularly visits patients in their homes for proactive care:

An 85-year-old woman receives regular care from the Hennepin EMS Community Paramedic (CP) team for leg wounds. Ten months ago, she and her husband's home had a Molotov cocktail thrown into it, burning the house to the ground and severely wounding the patient's legs. Two weeks ago, she bumped her leg on the cement steps leading up to her temporary apartment. On a wound check visit, our CP had concern for acute cellulitis of the wound and the patient's ongoing difficutly moving around. Using GoodSam, the video-conferencing app that connects EMS crews with EMS physicians, the CP was able to provide a real-time assessment of the wound, determine the need for antibiotics and come up with a follow-up plan for the patient with both Hennepin Healthcare's wound care clinic and ongoing CP care.
