HEMS BY THE NUMBERS



Hennepin Healthcare is officially the "the top employer in downtown Minneapolis."

According to recent data from the <u>Minneapolis Downtown Council</u>, Hennepin Healthcare employs **7,208** people downtown. This bumps down the previous top employer, Target, to the number two spot with **7,100** downtown workers. Meanwhile, the council also noted that in 2023, the population in downtown Minneapolis inched up **2.9%** to **58,409** residents.


